

WHAT IOWA'S ELECTION INTEGRITY LAW MEANS FOR VOTERS

IOWA VOTER IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

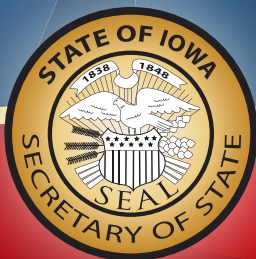
A voter who is pre-registered in the precinct where the voter lives is required to provide an approved form of identification or sign an oath of identification before receiving and casting a ballot at the polls. A voter who is registered in the county, but who has changed precincts will also be required to provide proof of residence.

A person who registers on Election Day at the polls is required to provide an approved form of identification and proof of residence.

A voter who cannot provide sufficient proof may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another voter registered in the precinct who has an approved form of identification or may cast a provisional ballot.

Beginning January 1, 2019, voters will be required to provide an approved form of identification before receiving and casting a ballot. A voter without ID may have another registered voter attest to the voter's identification, or may cast a provisional ballot.

Voter ID PIN Cards are issued only to registered voters who do not have an Iowa driver's license or a non-operator ID. If you lost your voter ID PIN card, contact the county auditor for a replacement.
