

WHAT DO I NEED TO REGISTER?

Registering to Vote at Your County Auditor's Office or By Mail

When registering to vote at your county auditor's office or by mail, you will need to fill out a Voter Registration Form. You will need either your driver's license, non-operator ID, or to know the last FOUR digits of your Social Security Number.

Registering to Vote at the

Department of Transportation

When you go to the Iowa Department of Transportation (DOT) to update your citizenship status, register to vote on-site.

CONGRATULATIONS!

Congratulations on becoming a United States citizen! This is a special milestone in your life, one that opens the door to many opportunities, like the right to vote!

You can vote in local, state, and federal elections in Iowa if you:

- ☐ Are United States citizen
- ☐ Are at least 18 years old on Election Day
- ☐ Are not a convicted felon (unless your voting rights have been restored by the Governor, including through Executive Order)
- ☐ An Iowa resident, with primary residence in the state

How do I serve as a poll worker?

To serve as a poll worker, you must:

- Be registered to vote in Iowa
- Be at least 17 years old
- Be a resident of the county you serve in
